- On-Demand performances available for those who can't travel to the theater





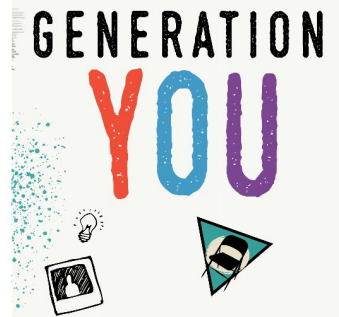
New Victory Classroom Workshops
